Welcome to the 1998 ISA Water Polo State Championships

With the addition of Boys and Girls Water Polo to the IHSA By Laws this year, as well as the potential of adding a State Series to each sport in the 1998-99 season, these are exciting times for ISA Water Polo!! It is vital to be informed about what is going on around the state as they will impact both our Girls and Boys programs. For those of you who came in late, let me recap what has taken place over the past 29 years.


Back in 1969, the ISA first sponsored a State Championship for Boys (Girls was later added in 1980). The league grew throughout the years and twice attempted to be added to the IHSA By Laws and to gain a State Series, each without success. Then in 1996, we started a campaign called "Water Polo 2000" in which our goal was to gain IHSA recognition and a state series by the year 2000. We made buttons, T-shirts and produced literature emphasizing the importance of educating the area swimmers, coaches and athletes how important Water Polo can be to their overall development of the aquatic programs in the schools. We formed the "Water Polo 2000 Committee" with Dave Perry and Tom Musch leading the way. The goals were simple: A.) Get more press coverage for our teams., B.) Educate ourselves on the process of being added as a sport to the IHSA By Laws and C.) Get a State Series.

As we spoke to Athletic Directors and Principals, it became obvious that we needed their support to make our goals become a reality. In the Spring of 1997, Mr. John Davis (Principal) and Mr. Doug Douval (Athletic Director) of Mundelein High School believed in our cause and drafted the original proposal that was submitted to the IHSA Legislative Committee for inclusion of Water Polo to the IHSA By Laws and the establishment of a State Series. After much debate and straw votes were held, the official vote was taken by the committee and passed by a overwhelming majority. The recommendation was then passed on to all Principals state wide to vote on. Town Hall meetings were held throughout the state and everyone seemed very keen on adding Water Polo to the By Laws. Late in November, a ballot was distributed for the actual vote. On December 17, 1997, Water Polo was added to the IHSA By Laws by a 3 to 1 majority vote of over 700 schools throughout the state of Illinois. Our biggest supporter was the IHSA Executive Director himself, Mr. David Fry. Through Mr. Fry's efforts, we now have a Water Polo Committee (currently headed by Mr. Fry) who are formulating a process to initiate a State Series for boys and girls. Their next meeting is scheduled for late May (just before our banquet). Mr. Fry has sent out surveys to all schools to get their feedback on the issue of granting water polo a state series. If they come back with a favorable response, one can only hope this will lead to the ultimate reward....A STATE SERIES IN 1999.

With all this to digest, we could be viewing our FINAL ISA Water Polo State Championship. I hope you enjoy it as both York and Neuqua Valley High Schools work as our host sites in 1998. I want to thank everyone for their hard work and dedication this year. As we look ahead, the future is bright. Let's never forget what it took to get here and hope that everyone will benefit with what is to come.

WATER POLO

A Player's/Viewer's Guide

A demanding game, water polo combines the strategy and interaction of a team sport with the skill and endurance of an individual sport. A team consists of 6 *field players* and a *goalie*. Field players may use only one hand on the ball — the goalie may use both; field players may not use the pool bottom immediately prior to, or while, receiving, throwing or blocking the ball, although the *shallow-end goalie* may. (The goal has been enlarged to offset this advantage.) When outside the 4-meter line a goalie loses these “privileges”, and in no case may he cross the center-line! The goalie may shoot, but not from off the bottom.

A high school game consists of four 7-minute periods with teams alternating ends each period. A period begins with each team *swimming off*, from the pool ends, for a ball dropped by the referee at the center-line. Following a goal the ball is put in play as soon as all players are in their half of the pool. There is a 2-minute interval after the 1st and 3rd periods and each overtime period; a 5-minute interval at half-time and before the 1st overtime. If a game is tied at the end of four quarters two 3-minute overtime periods are played; if still tied *sudden death* periods are played. Each team is allowed three time-outs during regulation -- one time-out per overtime.

Athletes and spectators need to be constantly aware of: a) the referee's whistle and hand signals, indicating violations, possession, points scored, ejections, etc.; b) the 35-second shot clock; and c) the 2, 4, and 7-meter (yard) lines. Unlike most sports, the referee may not be challenged and, in fact, may only be spoken to during time-outs or between periods, and only by the coach or team captain.

FOULS are separated into those that result in *loss-of-possession* only -- the opponent gets a *free throw* (the ball and a reasonable time to pass, pop, or dribble it) -- and those that result in an *ejection* or a *penalty shot*. **NOTE: On a free throw the ball must be touched by a second player before a shot can be taken...UNLESS THE FOUL OCCURS OUTSIDE THE 7-m. line, in which case the free-thrower may take an IMMEDIATE SHOT -- defense must treat the shot like any other free throw! (New rule last year.)** In general, a defensive foul is not called if calling it would negate an offensive advantage.

Loss-of-possession fouls include: touching the ball with *two hands*; using the pool *bottom* or *wall* to gain an advantage; taking or having a held-ball forced *underwater*; use of hands on an opponent not holding the ball (also, *going for the man instead of the ball*); *offside* (offensive player inside the 2-meter area ahead of or without the ball); *pushing-off* a defender, or swimming over him. The ball may be put in play at the point-of-foul, OR at any point nearer the center line, by the closest offensive player. **DEFENSE: 1) must not touch the unattended ball and 2) must be aware that the ball may be shot after the first throw (be alert whenever an offensive player pushes or tosses the ball to the hole player!!!).**

Ejections (20 seconds) are assessed for fouling an offensive player from behind, outside the 4-meter area; *interference* with a free throw; *unsportsmanship-like conduct*; and *illegal entry* (an ejected player must re-enter from the ejection area, at the referee's signal, without using the wall or bottom). A player with 3 ejections may not re-enter the game. *Brutality* (over-aggressive or repeated fouling) will result in suspension for the remainder of the game (with no substitute, i.e., team plays man-down rest of game) The offender is suspended from the following game as well.

A 4-meter/penalty shot (one-on-one vs. the goalie) is awarded when a shooter facing the goal is fouled from behind while inside the 4-m line, or if a shot is illegally prevented (off-the-bottom, 2-hands, goalie taking the ball under...). **NOTE: The coach may select any player to take the penalty shot.**

SCHOOL PROFILE

- ◆ Founded in 1888, The Latin School of Chicago is an independent, coeducational day school located on the Near North Side of Chicago. The School is accredited by the Independent School Association of the Central States (ISACS).

THE STUDENT BODY

- ◆ There are 990 students in grades JK-12.
- ◆ The School admits students from throughout Chicago and surrounding suburbs.

ACADEMICS

- ◆ The School offers a rigorous college preparatory curriculum that encourages independence, creativity, and curiosity with an emphasis on interdisciplinary learning.
- ◆ Graduation requirements: 4 credits in English language and literature; 3 in foreign language and literature; 3 in history and social science; 3 or 3.5 in mathematics; 3 in science; 4 in physical education; 1.5 in the fine arts; and 2.5 in electives. Ninth graders are required to take a 2-credit interdisciplinary humanities course.
- ◆ 13 AP classes and 7 honors courses are offered in the Upper School.

CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

- ◆ There are over 30 different clubs at Latin including Backstage, film club, ski club, student government, and yearbook. The performing arts program stages several full length productions each year, and students can participate in the Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, Dance Concert, or Chorus.
- ◆ The Lower School's Extended Day Program provides before- and after-school activities.

ATHLETICS

- ◆ The School is a member of the Independent School League (ISL).
- ◆ 20 interscholastic sports are offered and the School fields 60 teams; most sports have varsity, junior varsity, and middle school teams.
- ◆ 75% of students in the Middle and Upper Schools play on at least one athletic team during the year.
- ◆ In 1996-97, the boys cross-country team claimed the regional championship and their third-straight league championship; girls volleyball won their third-straight regional championship.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- ◆ Students at all grade levels participate in service projects, and every tenth grader is required to perform at least 40 hours of community service.
- ◆ The School assists High Jump, a program that prepares seventh- and eighth grade students with high academic potential and limited opportunities for admission to college preparatory high schools.
- ◆ The School's adult-education program, Live & Learn, provides evening and weekend classes for 5,000 Chicago-area adults annually.

SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TESTS (SAT)

- ◆ The Class of 1997 earned a mean score of 631 on the verbal portion and 613 on the math portion of the SAT-I. The mean 1997 national scores were 505 verbal and 511 math.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS

- ◆ The Classes of 1997 and 1998 took 213 Advanced Placement Exams; 74% of those 213 exams received scores of three or higher.

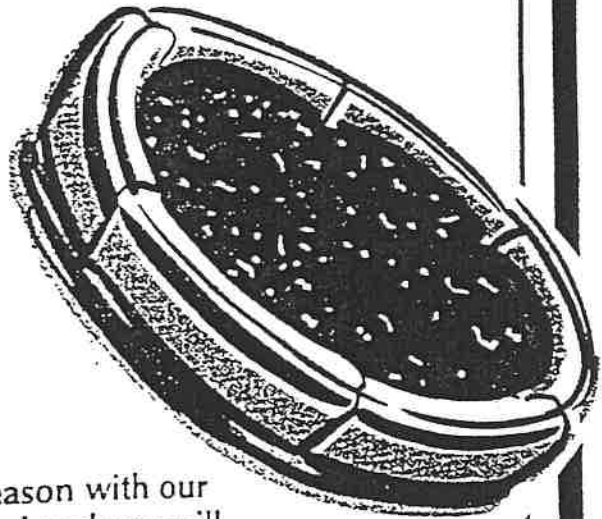
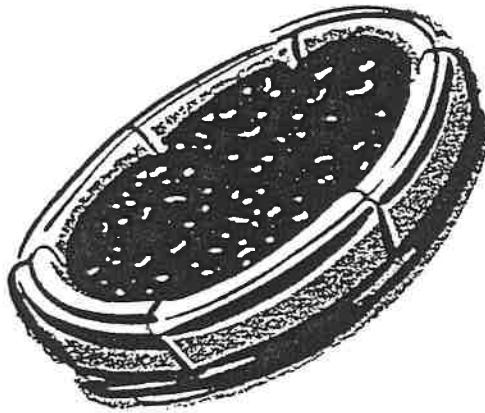
